

AVOCADO FRAMEWORK [DRAFT]

What?

The Avocado Framework is an emerging intergenerational and multi stakeholder platform designed to **bridge global climate negotiations with on-the-ground implementation**. It creates space for diverse actors—ranging from negotiators to community leaders—to co-develop and advance climate action projects that are both ambitious and achievable. Coordinated by the Global Youth Coalition (GYC), AF serves as both a **facilitator and accountability mechanism**, ensuring commitments are met through cross-sectoral and cross-cultural partnerships, consistent reporting, and collective learning.

Why?

International climate efforts often leave gaps between high-level dialogues and community-led realities. The Avocado Framework **supports negotiators** with actionable, timely inputs that ease the burden of COP preparations; **amplifies marginalized voices**, including historically underrepresented youth, Indigenous communities, and grassroots leaders; **connects grassroots, regional, to global**, allowing projects on the ground to influence policy and receive international backing; **promotes mutual accountability**, moving beyond promises toward implementation, transparency, and sustained collaboration.

Who?

COP negotiators, excluded communities, Mother Earth, corporations, governments, the changemakers (individuals)

How?

To join the AF, stakeholders must co-commit to work collaboratively on an implementation project with at least one other entity. Supported by GYC, members engage in monthly collaboration meetings, submit quarterly progress updates, report annually on implementation, and participate in three annual co-design sessions. Themed task forces for each of the three designated pillars on **the Trident** guide target-setting and implementation.

Timeline

1. Listen: Start by collecting insights from youth, Indigenous, and frontline communities to shape the framework. ✓
2. Define: Nature-Based Solutions, Clean C Just Energy Transition, and Loss C Damage Fund. ✓
3. Consult: Share the framework with Indigenous groups and stakeholders to integrate traditional knowledge and improve legitimacy.
4. Translate: Translate the pillars into specific policy recommendations aligned with ongoing negotiations.
5. Deliver: Submit inputs to governments after Bonn SB sessions, so they can be integrated before COP30 negotiations begin.
6. Mobilize: Through THE TRIDENT 20+10 sailing journey, we raise awareness and present the AF with unified youth voices at COP30.
7. Implement: Whether the negotiations succeed or not, the AF becomes a platform for decentralized action, connecting funders, youth, and solutions worldwide.
