Financial Highlights



At the Global Youth Coalition (GYC), we believe that transparency builds trust and collaboration. While we've made significant strides in mobilizing resources to empower youth and deliver impactful projects, we face financial challenges that hinder long-term sustainability.

In 2024, GYC achieved remarkable success despite limited funding. Here's how we've managed and allocated resources, and the pressing needs we must address to continue and scale our efforts.

REVENUE AND ALLOCATION OVERVIEW

Funds Received:

Reeforesting for Peace (R4P):

\$50.000 received from the Climate Emergency Collaboration Group (CECG) for youth training and advocacy.

Fully allocated to project implementation, outreach and team (\$15k).

Global Youth Climate Training (GYCT):

Funding from Oxford University's Van Houten Fund and ClimateWorks Foundation.


£60,000 per chapter allocated per training and materials.

Moderation stipends (\$200/session) and a **£10,000** fund distributed among active GYC members. Total Funds overall Received by GYC Team: **\$30,000**

These funds were used for team project execution, stipends, and essential costs.

Volunteer Contributions:

Our operations rely heavily on volunteers and core team members who dedicate their time and personal resources. This includes covering costs for software (e.g., Mailchimp, Canva), travel, and equipment without compensation.

Reeforesting4Peace

Youth leaders from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Saint Lucia, Brazil, Argentina, Ecuador, Bolivia, India, Egypt, Peru, and Indonesia received cutting-edge equipment and/or software to amplify their storytelling and content creation efforts. This initiative empowers them to share their perspectives, inspire local action, and drive global conversations on climate and social justice.

Our GYC Champs truly shone, facilitating discussions in a virtual space that bridged global divides. This metaverse session redefined inclusivity, eliminating the need for visas, flights, or badges—just pure intentions and a voice to speak for the planet.

Participants like Sisay Lucas, who later attended COP29 in Baku, and June Bartuin, an indigenous youth leader and mother, shared their unique perspectives. June powerfully raised concerns about representation as a young indigenous woman navigating the barriers to access spaces like COPs.

This session was a bold step toward creating equitable opportunities for youth to engage in decision-making spaces, even from the comfort of their own communities.

It was a truly impactful conclusion to an unforgettable training!



Together, we are building a global network of trained, empowered youth dedicated to a sustainable future

- Vice-Chancellor's Prize: GYCT was honored with the Vice-Chancellor's Prize, a recognition of its groundbreaking impact in global climate education and empowerment.
- Bursaries and Representation at COP29: Five bursaries were awarded to attendees who later represented youth at COP29 in Baku, including Seruni, whose powerful intervention at the closing plenary through YOUNGO amplified the voices of global youth.
- A Growing Task Force: At least 20 tracked participants attended COP29 independently, joining efforts as youth negotiators, country delegation members, and civil society advocates. Alumni from the first cohort, including Luji, Genaro, and Frederick, have already stepped into roles as negotiators and influential changemakers.

Looking Ahead:

With each cohort, the GYCT strengthens its mission to equip the next generation with the tools, knowledge, and network to lead the fight against climate change. As we grow, so does our impact, proving that the youth are not just the leaders of tomorrow they are leading today.





From 10,000 applicants, and after an intensive and rigorous review process, only 3% were selected to participate in this prestigious program. Our commitment to fostering interaction and meaningful participation guided this challenging selection process. Like a living organism, GYC operates through dynamic, self-driven teams and partnerships. Each member contributes their unique skills and passions, working toward clear missions and objectives with flexibility and purpose.

We believe in "Local to Global and Global to Local" advocacy. We encourage our members to start by understanding and addressing the challenges in their own territories before stepping onto the global stage. This approach ensures that our work is deeply rooted in local realities while influencing global change.



The GYC works as a mycelium of dedicated teams that coordinate various aspects of our operations and projects:

- Equipo R4P: Leading the charge in Reeforesting 4 Peace, using cinematography and storytelling to promote Nature-Based Solutions (NBS).
- **GYCT Team:** Driving our flagship Global Youth Climate Training program, fostering global connections, and empowering youth advocates.
- **COP Teams:** Coordinating GYC participation and impact at COPs (e.g. COP16 and COP29), including organizing the YTG Tree of Hope initiative and supporting "Stop Ecocide" campaigns.
- Energy and Clean Transitions Group (Y4E): Focusing on renewable energy advocacy and Clean Energy Transition (CET) solutions.
- FrÜTZ Game Development Team: Creating an innovative Al-driven social AR game platform to promote environmental stewardship.
- **Design & Content Team:** Producing booklets, toolkits, and visually compelling content to amplify GYC's message.
- LAC Regional Team: Collaborating with youth leaders from Latin America and the Caribbean to share and create opportunities for them to engage and support climate policies and processes related to the sustainable development goals along the civil society mechanism for children and youth for the agenda 2030 and REDFIS (NGO Network for Sustainable Finance in LATAM).



<u>Ripple Effect:</u> Alumni initiatives, local advocacy, and peer training amplify GYC's global footprint.

Youth Representation at COP29: At least 20+ program alumni were present, contributing actively, including Seruni's closing plenary intervention.

GYCT 2024: Focused on empowering MAPA (Most Affected People and Areas) and indigenous youth, with 227 MAPA participants and 69 identifying as indigenous.



WHY IT MATTERS

The Skin sets the vision. The Flesh brings the vision to life. The Seed is where action begins...because local actions fuel global change.

The Avocado Framework complements and builds on the Paris Agreement by providing a youth-led, action-oriented strategy that focuses on three key pillars: Clean Energy Transition, Loss & Damage, and Nature-Based Solutions (NBS). While the Paris Agreement establishes broad international commitments to limit global temperature rise and foster national climate action plans (NDCs), the Avocado Framework operationalizes these goals with a focus on implementation, inclusivity, and systemic change. It emphasizes youth engagement, equitable solutions, and collaboration with stakeholders to address climate challenges more dynamically and proactively.
